

TWO MISSING IN A LAUNCH.

**Atlantic City Youths Who Went After
Cod on Thursday Thought Lost.**

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., Feb. 13.—John Driscoll and William Andrews, each about 20 years old, left the Inlet on Thursday afternoon to go cod fishing in an open launch. They have not been seen nor heard of since, and it is feared they were caught in the northeast storm of Thursday and Friday and lost.

The young men borrowed an open launch twenty-three feet long equipped with a six and a half horse power engine, belonging to Capt. Samuel Gale, without the owner's consent. They had used it a fortnight ago, but had been forbidden to take it again. The young men were spoken by Capt. Adams of the fishing smack Chalfonte, who was coming in as they passed out the Inlet channel.

Several boats went out from the Inlet to-day to try to locate the young men and the boat, but although search was made all day long up and down the coast, nothing whatever was discovered of the missing launch and its occupants.

The parents of the young men are greatly worried, and fear they have been lost. Others, however, are hopeful that they may have been picked up by a passing steamer during the storm.
